



Her name was Fantine in Les Misérables, Fleur-de-Marie in Eugène Sue's Les Mystères de Paris. For Huysmans, she was Marthe; for Zola, simply, "Nana." In art, she was called "this Olympia woman from the Rue Mouffetard" Sarah Bernhardt was one of them too. Whether real or fictional, they all play their part on the boulevards of Paris, the greatest stage of all. At night, these dazzling idols, venal creatures, and whores-with-hearts-of-gold deck themselves out in garish colors, hoping to catch the eye of passing men. The clandestine prostitute denounced by the police as insoumise dances and spins in her scarlet stockings and high-heeled ankle-boots, her embroidered petticoats clenched in her fists. As she marches up and down the asphalt sidewalks, her eyes flash from beneath the shadow of her hat like a portrait in its frame. In the cafés, dancehalls, theaters, and racetracks of Paris, the visibility of these women infuriates both police prefects and family men; but it delights the bachelors, dandies, and flâneurs who also come alive at night under the gas-lights. Their names are Gérard de Nerval, Gustave Flaubert, the Goncourt brothers, Stendhal, or Joris-Karl Huysmans.

In those days, bohemian artists and women of ill repute lived in close contact, and often shared the same dismal fate. But their unholy union struck terror at the heart of the nineteenth-century bourgeois. In her exploration of modernity, marginality, and radically changing gender roles, Laure Katsaros brings the extraordinary world of dandies, *grisettes*, and brothel girls back to life, along with the fear and fascination inspired by this new world of love.





Alternating the point of view of Avirama Golan and the one of a friend whom Avirama Golan interviewed in the late 1980s, *t*his essay constitutes a historical-sociological survey of the situation of the Arabs in Israel.

It is also a discussion on the present, on the fear that the fragile balance between the two populations in Israel will collapse beneath the hatred and the fear, and the wounded grapevine tendril, which needs to heal, to be tied to a trellis and receive nurturing in order to blossom, will break and die.


